<b>Podmienky na absolvovanie predmetu:</b> 30% Active participation at seminars, participation in debates, preparedness for class; 20% Reflection; 10% Attendance; 40% Final essay. Course evaluation (%): A – excellent: 100-93%, B – very good: 92-84%, C – good: 83-74%, D – satisfactory: 73-63%, E – sufficient: 62-51%, Fx – fail: 50-0%. Passing the course assumes that student was not absent at more than 4 class sessions. Late arrival is marked as a “tardie”. Three tardies equal one absence. Missing more than 15 minutes of the class is considered an absence.
