| Requirements for the course: Course evaluation (%): A – excellent: 100-93%, B – very good: 92-84%, C – good: 83-74%, D – satisfactory: 73-63%, E – sufficient: 62-51%, Fx – fail: 50-0%. Passing the course assumes that the student was not absent at more than 4 class sessions. Late arrival is marked as a “tardie.” Three tardies equal one absence. | Learning outcomes: Students will further improve their ability to structure their thoughts in written essays and oral debates. They will revisit some classics in political thought and enhance their understanding of the history of political thought. | | | | | |
| Brief course outline: Based on our previous courses, we will have a closer look at the classics behind the leading political schools of thought: social democracy, conservatism, and liberalism. We will focus on Burke and the critiques of the Enlightenment. We will reread Marx and explore the ramifications of Marxism in the 20th century. We will debate the different meanings of liberalism. We will examine modern intellectual debates in their historical context and reflect on the very notion of <i>ideology</i> . | | | | | |
